Prior jobs include Director of Evidence, Monitoring and Evaluation at the Children's Investment Fund Foundation (CIFF) and Senior Monitoring and Evaluation (M&E) Advisor with the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (IFRC). Scott has also consulted with a variety of organizations, including the development of M&E capacity development resource for the Adaptation Fund as well as the Climate Investment Funds. Scott's work stresses participatory evaluation and pedagogy for adult learning. Scott has provided professional development workshops and e-learning globally in over 20 countries for organizations and professional associations such as EES, AEA, SAMEA, and ALNAP. He has also taught at universities in both the United States and abroad (China and Taiwan). Scott has authored numerous articles, books, and guidelines on evaluation and capacity development, notably the 430-page resource book co-authored with Brad Cousins, *Monitoring and Evaluation Training: A Systematic Approach*, (2016, Sage Publications).

In regards to Real-Time Evaluation (RTE), Scott has extensive experience commissioning, managing and conducting RTEs in his 10+ years working with the international Red Cross Red Crescent. He has developed and delivered training curriculum on RTEs in both humanitarian and non-humanitarian contexts, and in 2016 he authored the IFRC's Real-Time Evaluation Guide. He has also advised with ALNAP on RTEs, and delivers an annual course on RTE with the Encompass Learning Center.
